Parent Champion Programme

- We started the programme in the Doncaster Family Hub in 2018.
- Doncaster Family Hubs are split into 4 localities; East, South, Central and North. I work in the East of Doncaster, and I have currently 6 Parent Champions.
- Across Doncaster Family Hubs, we have two Early Years Development Workers who had started as a Parent Champion and one, who has just recently moved to public health, who also started her journey as a Parent Champion.

Parent Champion Role





- Promote and share positive experiences of the Family Hub Services and Early Education through:
- Being out and about in the community
- In Family Hub groups
- Soft play centres/playgroups
- Social media
- Hand out leaflets at school, shops etc.

Two-year Data

East Locality of Doncaster 84.6%

Moorends 92.8 %

Stainforth 77.4%

Armthorpe 85.7 %

We aim to identify where every child is in Doncaster; whether that is accessing a provision through two-year funding or engaging with Doncaster Family Hubs

Twoyear Funding Work



How Covid impacted Two-year funding

- Due to the pandemic, we were not able to visit families, therefore we had to try to contact families through telephone calls and letters.
- We had no face-to-face groups in the Family Hubs or in the community to promote the funding.
- The only method to contact families who were not members of the Family Hub, was using letters and these were unsuccessful.

This meant ...

- •Last term we only had 46% successful contacts.
- •The majority of families contacted were already members of the Family Hub.

Time to change change strategies and give Parent Champions more of a goal to work towards.

Work in partnership with other services and the community to promote two-year funding and reach families that are not known to the Family Hub.

Action Plan

Working collaboratively to promote and support families to access two-year funding;

- Food Banks
- Job Centres
- Health visitors
- Doncaster Family Information Service
- Community Groups
- Schools and Early Years settings
- Changing lives through Child Webinar care

Bringing the Parent Champions to the Forefront of Two-year funding.

Attend Local Food Bank monthly

School and early setting parents evening

Jobcentres events

Work alongside an Early Years Development Worker on two-year funding visits.

Leaflet drop/two-year funding display in Jobcentre and libraries.

Summer fayres

Look at every Parent Champion individually. Ensuring that every Parent Champion is comfortable with the extra responsibilities, before implementing the action plan

Supporting Parent Champions

- Two-year funding and every contact counts to support the Parent Champions.
- EYDW to role model good communication and engagement within the visits and at events.
- Good communication between Parent Champion Coordinators and 2yr leads (I'm both so this should be easy).
- Training for their CPD.
- A monthly meeting with Parent Coordinator and Parent Champions to support, encourage and empower the Parent Champions.

The Grand Event

A big event, which will promote and support Families though;

- Promoting Family Hub Services and Early Education.
- Inviting other services to promote and encourage parents to get back into employment or Education.

- Food Bank
- Job Centre
- POB Adult Learning
- Provisions
- Community Groups
- Parent Champions/Volunteers

Benefits of Collaborative Working

Children

- A child attending an Early Years provision would have a positive impact on their development.
- Research has identified children from low-income families can fall behind academically, compared to children from a higher income family. Early education will close this gap.

Parents/Carers

A parent/carer going back into employment or education alongside their child attending early education can have a more significant impact on a child's development and health.
