12.45pm Workshop 3 | Retention and return: Delivering the expansion of early years entitlement in England

Kate will take us through research which looks at the working conditions and experiences of those currently working in the early years sector and those who have recently left. The research team gathered nearly 1,000 surveys and 60 participants in interviews and focus groups. It aims to better understand the conditions of the current early years workforce, the implications of the extended entitlement and what is needed to ensure any expansion of access can be successful, while ensuring the high-quality places that children deserve.
